## New: COVID-19 Updates for QPP

### **New COVID-19 Clinical Trials Improvement Activity**

As part of the recently announced Medicare interim final rule with comments CMS added a new high-weighted improvement activity to the 2020 QPP Improvement Activities Inventory that promotes participation in COVID-19 clinical trials and clinical reporting for COVID-19 related care. To receive credit for the new COVID-19 clinical trials (IA\_ERP\_3) improvement activity, MIPS-eligible clinicians must attest to participation in a COVID-19 clinical trial utilizing a drug or biological product to treat a patient with a COVID-19 infection and report their findings through clinical data repository or clinical data registry for the duration of their study. CMS has added this improvement activity to provide an opportunity for clinicians to receive credit in MIPS for the important work they are doing across the country.

### **Telehealth Implementation & Workflow Tips During the COVID-19 Emergency Fact Sheet**

Telehealth has been implemented by many of our practices during the COVID-19 emergency so that everyone can practice social distancing and

stay at home. The Medicare population, especially those with comorbid conditions, are most at risk. Telehealth provides an opportunity for patients to stay home and receive healthcare for non-emergency medical conditions. ## Now Available: PI Hardship Exception Application

### PI Hardship Exception Application is Now Open for 2020

If you have any of the following circumstances, you may qualify for a re-weighting of the Promoting Interoperability performance category (to 0%):

- You're a small practice
- You have decertified EHR technology
- You have insufficient Internet connectivity
- You face extreme and uncontrollable circumstances such as disaster, practice closure, severe financial distress or vendor issues
- You lack control over the availability of CEHRT

Beginning with performance year 2020, you will need a HCQIS Access Roles and Profile (HARP) account to submit a MIPS Promoting Interoperability Performance Category Hardship Exception Application. Once you sign into QPP with your credentials, select 'Exceptions Application' on the left-hand navigation and then select 'Promoting Interoperability Hardship.' The online

application can be found by logging into your HARP account [here](#). The application will close 12/31/2020. If your application is approved, you do not have to report for the MIPS Promoting Interoperability performance category and the category will be re-weighted to 0% of your final score. The 25% weighting of the Promoting Interoperability performance category will be redistributed to another performance category (or categories) unless you choose to submit data.

## New Measures and Activities for 2020

Continuing our in-depth look at new measures and activities for the year, this month we will look at the new Quality Measure 478:

### *Functional Status Change for Patients with Neck Impairments*

This High Priority Patient Reported Outcome Measure was developed for Orthopedic Surgeons, Physical and Occupational Therapists and Chiropractors-although it may not apply to all clinicians within these specialties. It consists of a patient-reported outcome measure (PROM) of risk adjusted change in functional status (FS) for patients aged 14+ with neck impairments. The change in FS is assessed using the Neck FS PROM. The measure is risk-adjusted to patient characteristics known to be associated with FS outcomes. It is used as a performance measure at the patient, individual clinician, and clinic levels to assess quality.
